

## Colegio Alberto Einstein School Profile - Class of 2014

Quito, Ecuador

<u>Mission:</u> Colegio Alberto Einstein is a not-for-profit, bilingual, secular educational community founded by the Jewish Community of Ecuador, based on universal principles of Jewish culture and centered on students' comprehensive education. Our contribution to society is educating well-rounded, analytical, and critical students endowed with ethical values and the knowledge and skills needed to succeed in a changing world.

About our School: Colegio Alberto Einstein offers schooling from Pre-School to 12<sup>th</sup> grade to students from all nationalities, religions, and backgrounds. We are an Ecuadorian school with a bilingual program, and a large part of our staff is made up of international teachers. Our student-teacher ratio is 7:1. Students who attend Colegio Einstein have the privilege of being in the International Baccalaureate program starting with the Primary Years Program, followed by the Middle Years Program, and ending with the Diploma Program. From Pre-Kindergarten through 3<sup>rd</sup> grade, in addition to the school's bilingual Spanish-English curriculum, students are required to study Hebrew. From 4<sup>th</sup> grade through 10<sup>th</sup> grade, students have the option of continuing with their Hebrew studies, or to begin studying French. In the Diploma program, they are able to continue with their French studies.

<u>History:</u> Colegio Alberto Einstein was founded in 1973 by the Jewish Community of Ecuador. In 1996, Colegio Einstein adapted the International Baccalaureate program into its curriculum. In 2008, Colegio Einstein joined AASSA, and in 2010 the school became accredited by AdvanceD-SACS.

<u>Grades:</u> In the Diploma program, students take an average of 10 classes per year. This grade distribution includes the Class of 2014's grades from the past four years:

<u>SAT I Results:</u> The majority of our students take the SAT at the end of their junior year, and once again in the beginning of their senior year of high school. The following chart shows the score range of the middle 50% SAT I of the Class of 2014:

<u>TOEFL</u>: Like the SAT I, most students take the TOEFL at the end of their junior year and once again in their senior year. The average TOEFL score for the Class of 2014 was: **89** on the iBT.
